Nina de Gelder

Nina de Gelder is the Executive
Director of A4 - Space for
Contemporary Culture since
January 2019. For most of her
professional life, she has worked
as a project manager in the
field of culture and international
relations. Before joining the
A4 team, she worked as a
Vice-Rector for International
Cooperation at the Academy of
Fine Arts and Design in Bratislava.

A4 is an independent cultural centre focusing on contemporary forms of professional theatre, dance, music, film, visual art and new media. Established in 2004.

In A4, Nina prepares the programming of educational activities. A4 aims to provide

interactive forms of education in the field of contemporary art for students, professionals working in the field of culture, as well as for the general public. The public attends film screenings and talks, dealing with important topics of art, human rights, civil society and environmental protection. Lectures, discussions and workshops tend to open the important social and professional questions too. A4 works with local organizers and associations co-producing and presenting popular lectures on visual art, discussions relating to the culture and creative industries, cultural management, or presentations of important projects and personalities. It provides space for workshops and community sessions.

#### CO-HOST



Nada Uherová

Mgr.art. Nad'a Uherová, ArtD. Theater Director, dramatura and acting coach. She studied at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava, where she accomplished her doctorate in 2015. Since 2009, she has been a part of the World Theatre Training Institute, where she continues to be active in the teachings of lecturers led by the Russian director and prof. Dr. Yuri Alschitz and other world experts in the Russian acting school. She has been sharing her knowledge as a lecturer through theatre workshops and creative team buildings for more than ten years in Slovakia and Austria.

Since the start of her career, she has met and built relationships

with many students from various careers and social backgrounds. She founded the everydayACTOR project in 2015, through which she decided to share and show how the art of acting can be useful for everyone and everyday life. Hundreds of clients have taken her courses. As a director and dramaturgist, she has worked with the Bratislava Puppet Theatre, the Ludus Theatre, the Polish Teatr Tecza. Also. she is the founder of the theatre company LUNA storytelling, which focuses on the original stories of different cultures. She works as an author, director and actress.





#### RESEARCHER



Sheelagh Colclough

Sheelagh Colclough is a Belfast based artist with a research led practice grounded in her experience in arts education, facilitation and participation; presenting, publishing and exhibiting in the UK and Europe. She is a PhD researcher at Belfast School of Art, Ulster University, examining participatory art practices in Northern Ireland.

Working through Trans Europe
Halles member Beat Carnival,
building on a twenty year
professional relationship as

member, Sheelagh is the SPOTing
project researcher helping

at the University of Groningen.
Currently, she is doing European
Solidarity Corps at Trans Europe
Halles.

Trans Europe Halles is one of the oldest and most dynamic cultural networks in Europe currently with 127 members in 36 different countries across Europe – from Spain to Ukraine.

TEH have been at the forefront of repurposing abandoned buildings for arts, culture and activism since 1983. TEH don't organise arts educational activities themselves, its role is to facilitate knowledge exchange between arts educators within the network. As an ESC volunteer, Natalia is given an opportunity to learn the ins and outs of the cultural sector and the workings of non-profit organisations.

#### DIERA DO SVETA



Janka Hanzelová Mikušová

Janka Hanzelová Mikušová, studied Theatre Studies and has participated in several theatre plays as a head-curator of the cultural centre Diera do sveta. Róbert Repka is a co-curator at Diera do Sveta. He holds a Master of Arts degree in Cultural Anthropology at Uppsala University, and Master's degree in Public Policy at Comenius University, Bratislava. He is experienced in qualitative and quantitative research, fieldwork, and ethnographic methods.

Founded in 2014, Diera do sveta is a cultural centre and a specialised bookshop based in Liptovský Mikuláš, Slovakia. It strives for interaction between

the audience and contemporary arts and culture in order to generate values that pose an alternative to contemporary dominant narratives and socio-political organisation. The cultural centre participates with various collectives and educational institutions to provide informal seminars, workshops, discussion and lectures on contemporary issues and crises. Moreover, it cooperates with local high schools to prepare particular sessions dedicated to a younger audience.

Their speech will give an overview of the education and cultural activities which focuses on topics of gender equality and feminism, ecology, science as well as on current socio-political and economic crises. At the same time, they do not disregard contemporary debates in art and culture and their emancipatory and imaginative potential for various communities and society as a whole.





#### KEY NOTE SPEECH



François Matarasso

François Matarasso is a freelance community artist, writer and researcher. His 1997 report, 'Use or Ornament?', established influential concepts in cultural policy. Between 2011 and 2015 he produced a series of publications on undervalued areas of cultural life under the collective title «Regular Marvels». His latest book « A Restless Art - How participation won and why it matters», was published in 2019. He has worked in about 40 countries and held honorary professorships in the UK and Australia.

He is a partner in Traction which is researching how technology can support opera co-creation and social inclusion. It looks at opera co-creation as a pathway to social and cultural inclusion, through projects with migrants and disabled people in Barcelona, young prisoners in Portugal and people in remote or rural Ireland.

Traction uses an innovative capabilities approach to evaluate (among other things) the informal education outcomes including artistic, technical, social and personal skill development.

The talk will ask how participatory art can support informal education through a case study of an ongoing EU-funded research project. Although it is too early to report traction's outcomes, the talk will focus on the novel conceptual framework being developed to understand personal and social change.





# SLOVAK ACADEMY OF SCIENCES



Timotea Vráblová works as a researcher and literary scholar. She is a teacher at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and has given lectures in several different countries. She is also an author of books and articles, a scriptwriter for Slovak radio, and a translator. She has participated several times as a jury member or a chairwoman for the national competition Miraculous Nuts and international competition Prix Ex Aequo in radio plays for children and young adults. She became the Co-chair of OMC subgroup aimed at reading promotion in a digital environment. She is a founder of the Centre for deep reading development:

Timoteas Vráblová Reading Playground and worked on the Concept of Development of Children's Reading Competences through Cultural Education Aimed.

Timotea is a founder of IBBY INSTITUTE BRATISLAVA, an international centre for research and development of cultivated, or reflective reading. It initiates international activities in public and professional fora, and develops educational and artistic activities in terms of its main goals.

She will present the topic Psychology of young audience through questions to inspire people and make them think about all possible sorts of problems in advance:

- How to build up a well-balanced programme structure, to educate a young audience in a stimulating and healthy way from a psychological standpoint?
- How do we talk about the newly emerging needs of children and young adults and a new concept of childhood?
- What consequences follow "topicomania"?
- Do we really contribute to strengthening individual person?





#### STANICA

Hana and Simona are connecting the two decades long founder experience of the first with the fresh few years view of the second.

They operate in two venues of Truc sphérique association in Žilina, Slovakia: Stanica and Nová Synagóga. Lately, they have been working mostly on gallery

education in Synagóga, where apart from programs for kids and families they also develop new forms of communication and guidance for adult laymen public.

Their seminar speech will present their educational strategies in the gallery from last year. They will talk about the formats that arose from pandemic restrictions and highlight their little discoveries.

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#### CENTRO ITALIANO STORYTELLING



Giovanna Conforto

Giovanna Conforto is an International Storyteller with 20 years of experience. She is a founding member of Stories in Place and is the Creative Director of the Italian Storytelling Centre where she speaks on behalf of it and of Flavio Milandri of the Metamuseo Girovago.

The Italian Storytelling Centre is the only Centre in Italy working on applied storytelling. Giovanna is part of the educationalinstitution's School of Storytelling, Emerson College (UK) and IED Master's degree in Arts Management.

Her talk will be about storytelling and museums in general, her experience at the Uffizi Gallery in Florence, and then she will present the case study «Storytelling @ Museum of the future ». It is a collaboration between the Metamuseo Girovago (Travelling Metamuseum) and the Italian Storytelling Centre. Flavio Milandri has been a storyteller in residency at the Metamuseo Girovago at Centro Commerciale «I Portici» in Forli, a local shopping mall. The space was abandoned and came back to life through an exhibition and storytelling events partially during lockdown.







Brechtje Van Bel is an artisticeducational employee, at hetpaleis, and Hussein Al-Khalidi, theatre-maker and actor from Baghdad, Iraq.

Hetpaleis is a theatre for children, young people and performing artists in the heart of Antwerp, Belgium. It is the largest theatre for children and young people in Benelux. It has two theatre venues. It also has rehearsal rooms and runs a broad range of educational workshops. Hetpaleis produces, creates and presents high-quality theatre for all ages.

Hetpaleis organises schoolworkshops and workshops during holidays. The workshops are held inside hetpaleis as on location. Each week hetpaleis organises theatre classes. The community work project is part of these classes.

Hussein and Brechtje will bring you an example of how theatre itself can change through community work.

Nebojsa Milikic

Nebojsa Milikic is a cultural worker and producer, who lives and works in Belgrade, Serbia. Since 1990 he has been engaged in political activism, organizational, artistic and curatorial practice in visual and relational arts, independent research, public debate and critical writing about cultural and political problems of transitional societies

He publishes in various activist and art portals, participates in collaborative projects, activist research and campaigns in his own country and other countries abroad. From 1999 onward he worked in Cultural Centre Rex in Belgrade, as the initiator and coordinator of various programmes and projects.

Finally, he is a member of the initiative No To Rehabilitation dedicated to the struggle against historical revisionism and negation.

Currently, he is engaged in the coordination of the reading group "(Knowing) The Good, the Bad and Evil" that analyses the relation of politics and art ideology in the works of classical literature. He is also involved in learning about the economic capacities and qualities of patching internationally.

He should be running the course "From Classical Despise via Class Hatred towards Classy Punishment" for the Summer School as a School in Prishtina (KS). He prepares the project by disseminating specialist knowledge in the field of theory and history of art within the platform Association of Independent Cultural Scene of Serbia.
